

Jochen Fried is the director of Education at the Salzburg Global Seminar. In this capacity he is responsible for the development and implementation of the Seminar's Mellon Fellow Community Initiative, International Study Programs for students and faculty, and other related Education programs. He is the former director of the Universities Project of the Salzburg Global Seminar. Prior to joining the Seminar in 1998, he worked as head of programs at the Institute for Human Sciences in Vienna, and as senior officer in the secretariat of the German Science Council in Cologne, Germany. After receiving a doctorate in German literature from Düsseldorf University, Germany in 1984, he was lecturer at Cambridge University, United Kingdom, and at the University of Ljubljana, Slovenia, under the auspices of the German Academic Exchange Service. He was a visiting scholar at Smith College in Northampton, Massachusetts, at Morehouse College in Atlanta, Georgia, and was a Fulbright scholar-in-residence at San Jose State University in California and Bronx Community College in New York during the 2007-2008 academic year. Dr. Fried's main area of professional interest is higher education and research policy. He serves as an expert for national and international institutions and organizations including the Austrian Federal Ministry for Education, Science and Culture; the European Union; The Council of Europe, the European Cultural Foundation, UNESCO-CEPES; and is a member of the executive board of the European Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences (ECOLAS).
