The UIEN also welcomes many students desiring to improve their competencies in various other foreign languages (Italian, English, Spanish).

Teachers of French as a foreign language hoping to invigorate their teaching methodology whilst also acquiring new linguistic and cultural perspectives are also welcome.

Program Quality

THE TEACHING TEAM

A dynamic team of teachers, all with relevant university degrees, is coordinated by a group of directors drawn from each of the languages offered.

A DYNAMIC APPROACH TO TEACHING

All lessons are created according to the *Common European Framework of Reference for Languages*. Various tools are used including the most up-to-date teaching methods and primary source documents. After encountering various communication situations in the classroom, students will quickly achieve greater autonomy outside of the classroom as well.

Lessons take place in multimedia laboratories, audio-visual rooms and traditional classrooms.

We guarantee a course that includes of the fundamental components that a French language learning experience in France should have: teaching, leisure and individualised help. The quality of our program has been officially recognised by the label "Qualité Français Langue Étrangère" awarded by the French Education Minister, the Culture and Communication Minister as well as the French Foreign Secretary.

GAINING UNIVERSITY ACCREDITATION

Each session of language lessons is worth 6 ECTS credits.

THE LANGUAGE RESOURCE CENTRE

Our language resource centre is a specialised reading and studying space containing numerous books and newspapers as well as online resources to help facilitate language acquisition.

Learn and Study French

Dates: French courses 2010

1st session: 1st - 28th July
 2nd session: 2nd - 27th August

Total number of classes: 75 hours per session

A diagnostic test will take place on the first day of each session to create groups of students with similar language levels. After the test students will be placed into small groups (maximum 18 students per group).

All students must attend the diagnostic test:

- July 2nd at 9 a.m. for the first session
- August 3rd at 9 a.m. for the second session

Enrolment deadline:

- June 15th 2010 for the July session
- June 25th 2010 for the August session

All levels are accepted, even true beginners. *NB: July 14th is a public holiday*

Teaching

French teaching at the UIEN is geared towards communication and is based on the Council of Europe's recommendations for modern languages. All students are tested upon their arrival and are subsequently placed into groups according to their level. During your training, the teaching support team will be at your disposal to help ensure your individual progress.

All levels are accepted, even true beginners.

The French programme

- Mornings: Monday- Friday 9-12 a.m.: language-culture class
- Afternoons: Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays 1.30-3.30 pm: workshops

Students can pick two workshops according to their level and interests.

Aims of the language-culture class:

This class aims to help students of all levels improve their oral communication skills whilst also developing their written language abilities in professional, academic and everyday situations.

Aims of the workshops:

The workshops aim to provide students with as much practice as possible in diverse aspects of French language and culture. Depending upon the chosen theme, emphasis is placed varyingly upon comprehension and expression, both oral and written.

Exemples of workshops levels:

Level 1: French culture, oral practice.

Level A1-A2: Oral practice, Chansons françaises, Civilisation, Cinema, Media, Written expression.

Level B1-B2: Cinema, Civilisation, Theatre, Art, Oral practice, Business French.

Level C1-C2: Design Your Own Europe: think about and construct the European Union, Media,

Civilisation: The big myths of French history, Legal French, Spoken French, 20th

century literature, Theatre, The path to a French university.

The workshops will be presented by the professors at the start of each session to help students to make their choice.

We reserve the right to cancel certain workshops if an insufficient number of students enrol.

NB: Tuesday July 14th is a public holiday.

ECTS Credits, Certificates and Certifications

ECTS CREDITS

Each session is equivalent to 6 ECTS credits, divided as follows:

- Language-culture classes: 4 ECTS credits

- Workshops: 2 ECTS credits

To obtain ECTS credits, students must meet all academic requirements communicated to them.

CERTIFICATES

At the end of the session, students will receive a certificate indicating their level of language proficiency as well as the number of classes attended. The levels correspond to those defined by the Council of Europe:

A1: Breakthrough B1: Threshold C1: Effective Operational Efficiency

A2: Waystage B2: Vantage C3: Mastery

CERTIFICATION

At the end of each session, students may take the *Teste de connaissance de français (TCF)* at an extra cost of 45 euros.

The TCF is a language placement test recognised by the French Ministry of Education and is valid for two years.

ENGLISH, ITALIAN, SPANISH

Dates of English, Italian, and Spanish courses

Two sessions:

1st session: 1st-28th July
 2nd session: 2nd-27th August

The English, Italian and Spanish courses are aimed at:

- students beginning university studies
- non-specialist students.
- anybody wishing to improve their English, Italian or Spanish

These courses aim to improve students' oral and written skills as well as their knowledge of the culture associated with the target language.

All levels are accepted, even true beginners.

Total number of hours: 75 per session

A diagnostic test will take place on the first day of each session to create groups made up of students with similar language levels. After the test students will be placed into small groups (maximum 18 students per group).

All students must attend the diagnostic test:

English course:

- June 30th at 9 a.m. for the first session
- August 3rd at 9.30 a.m. for the second session

Italian course:

- June 30th at 9.30 a.m. for the first session
- August 3rd at 10 a.m. for the second session.

Spanish course:

- June 30th at 10 a.m. for the July session.
- *NB: The Spanish course will only take place in the month of July.
- July 14th is a public holiday.

SCHEDULE

- MORNINGS: Monday-Friday 9-12 a.m.: language-culture class
- AFTERNOONS: Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays 1.30-3.30 p.m.: workshops

Students can pick two workshops depending on their level.

Aims of the language-culture class:

This class aims to help students of all levels improve their oral communication skills whilst also developing their written language abilities in professional, academic and everyday situations.

Aims of the workshops:

The workshops aim to provide as much practice as possible in diverse aspects of the language and culture of the target language. Depending upon the theme, emphasis is placed varyingly upon comprehension and expression, both oral and written.

English, Italian and Spanish example workshops:

Cinema, the media, oral practice, writing, civilisation, literature, business English/ Italian/ Spanish, Test of English for International Communication (TOEIC) preparation, review in preparation for the *Certificat de Compétences en Langues de l'Enseignement Supérieur et de la Recherche* (CLES).

The workshops will be presented by the professors at the start of each session to help students to make their choice.

We reserve the right to cancel certain workshops if an insufficient number of students enrol

TEACHING COURSE

These courses are designed for teachers of French as a foreign or second language - either at the start of their training or as further training- wishing to reinvigorate their teaching practices whilst also acquiring new linguistic and cultural perspectives.

DATES

Two sessions:

- 2nd-28th July
- 4th-27th August

Total number of hours: 79 per session

The programme

- Every morning from 9-12 a.m.
- Afternoons: Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays from 1:30-3:30 p.m.

ENROLMENT FEE

800 euros (including a 300 euros non-refundable deposit)

We ask participants to enrol at the secretary's office at 11 a.m. on July 1st or August 3rd. There is no diagnostic test.

Enrolment deadline:

- June 15th 2010 for the July session
- June 25th 2010 for the August session

ORGANISATION

These sessions are organised into interactive teaching workshops that take into account the latest research into FLES teaching methods.

The full course programme is given out to participants on the first day of class day.

At the end of the session, participants leave with a teaching "tool-box", that includes all the documents and materials used throughout the course.

EXEMPLES OF TRAINING MODULES

FLES teaching methodology

Aim: to reflect on current debates regarding teaching methodology in order to identify the various needs and objectives of the teaching/learning of French as a foreign language. Participants will also be familiarised with the use of CEFR (The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages).

Teaching Grammar

Two Conferences on Teaching Grammar

Aim: to analyse different approaches to teaching grammar along with different forms of grammar exercises in order to find a place for them in the teaching/ learning of FLES. Participants will also increase their awareness of the ways in which meaning is transmitted as well as the effects of discourses related to the traditional categories of modern French.

Analysis and Development of Teaching Aids

Aim: to understand how to analyse FLES teaching methods not only to facilitate the choice and/or modification of a teaching manual for a particular target class, but also to inspire participants to design their own activities and expand their teaching materials through online resources, such as those on the website of the French language TV station, TV5 MONDE.

Activities to Animate Classes

Aim: to inject dynamism into language classes by stimulating the learner through the use of fun and creative activities.

Theatre

Aim: development of speaking and personal expression through work on intonation and body language in a theatre workshop.

We reserve the right to cancel and change certain modules

CERTIFICATE

A certificate stating the titles of the workshops attended and the total hours completed will be awarded at the end of the session.

Should you wish to find your own accommodation, we suggest you opt for somewhere close to the no. 22 bus route to ensure you have easy access to the University of Nice- Sophia Antipolis every day. The no. 22 runs right through the centre of Nice (Boulevard de Cimiez, Avenue Carabacel, Rue Hôtel des Postes, Rue de la Liberté, Place Grimaldi, Rue Barla and Rue de France).

ENROLMENT PROCESS

• Candidates must return a completed "fiche de pré-inscription" to us along with a deposit of 300€ and the required documents. The remaining 400€ for language courses or 500€ for teaching courses must be sent to us no later than June 25th 2010 for the August session.

Full registration will only be effective once the entire balance has been paid.

 Candidates taking advantage of the numerous accommodation/catering options we propose must send the required balance before May 15th 2010 (allocation of a room is dependent upon availability).

Allocation of accommodation is dependent upon the receipt of an obligatory 35 Euro administration fee.
